
Early Starters Retain The Lead WW Winter Series 2017 Race 10 (7 Jun 2017)



Although the fleet came together as the race progressed it was the early starters that held the mid fleet and late starters at bay. Of the 12 early finishers 9 yachts were early starters, two from mid fleet and 1 late starter. The Triton 24 DOLPHIN PLAY (John Brennan) led the race from beginning to end for her 2nd win of the series. Finishing 5 minutes 24 seconds behind the winner was the other Triton 24 in the race, WILLARIE (Graeme Kaufman), who kept her 2nd place from start to finish. Finishing in 3rd place only 10 seconds behind WILLARIE was FIREFOX (Kim Beveridge & Howard Davies) recording her first podium finish of the series. MELTEMI SYC (Ian Howarth) became the 9th winner of Start of the Day when she crossed the start line 2 seconds late for her 30 minute handicap. It probably comes as no surprise to learn that NUTCRACKER II (Rob Davis & Andy Baker) sailed the course in the fastest time. She started last and finished 29th but sailed the course 10 minutes 29 seconds faster than any other yacht.



The forecast for Port Philip was "Variable about 10 knots" and 10 knots was the average recorded for the afternoon at Fawkner Beacon. There was an easterly component to the breeze which could have resulted in some variation particularly inshore. However, there was enough breeze to drive the 35 yacht fleet around the 6 leg 9.9 nautical mile course.

After sitting in 2nd place for 3 consecutive weeks a tie for 6th place put CASSANDRA of MELBOURNE (Bob Reeves) on top of the aggregate. She replaces SALTSHAKER (Ken Gayler) who has been leading the aggregate for the last 3 weeks. UPBEAT (Peter Dunne), who tied for 6th place, moved up from 6th to be 3rd in the aggregate.



DOLPHIN PLAY won race 8 by a margin of 9 minutes 15 seconds after starting with a handicap of minus 20 minutes. She had a handicap of minus 10 minutes for this race but was still able to win by a margin of 5 minutes 24 seconds. DOLPHIN PLAY had her best start of the series and 3rd best of this race when she started 4 seconds late for her handicap. She led the race from beginning to end recording the 2nd slowest elapsed time of 2:32:14. DOLPHIN PLAY has completed 6 races with mixed results. For example, she finished 25th in a fleet of 29 yachts in race 9 but was first in this race of a fleet of 35 yachts. Both races were around the same course. Her win in this race raises her 3 places in the aggregate from 33rd to 30th.

WILLARIE is one of 8 yachts to have completed 7 races this series. She has 3 top ten finishes which includes a win (race 2) a 2nd place in this race and a 5th place in race 3. She began this race 22 seconds late for her minus 7 minute handicap from 2nd place. WILLARIE sailed the first 3 legs of the course in 1:13:40 and was still in 2nd place. She completed the last 3 legs of the course in 1:10:36 and crossed the finish line at 15:57:38. She started 2 minutes 18 seconds behind DOLPHIN PLAY. Was 7 minutes and 23 seconds behind at the first rounding of number 4 and made up some time in the final 3 legs to finish 5 minutes 24 seconds behind. This 2nd place raised WILLARIE from 20th to 12th place in the aggregate.







This was the first podium finish in 4 races for FIREFOX. Her handicap at the start of the series was 28 minutes but has fallen to 21 minutes for this race. FIREFOX stated from 11th place 14 seconds late for her handicap. She had moved into 4th place at the first rounding of number 4, still 21 minutes 21 seconds behind the race leader. During the final 3 legs of the race she narrowed the gap to 5 minutes 25 seconds when she crossed the finish line at 15:57:39. FIREFOX sailed the course in 2:06:39. This was 3 minutes 55 seconds faster than BON VIVANT (Russell Keays); 7 minutes 12 seconds faster than PIZAZZ (P Martyn & R Kemp); and, 13 minutes 27 seconds faster than MARIBEL (Graham Frazer) who started off a 20 minute handicap. FIREFOX is sailing as a casual entry so is not

listed in the aggregate.

Thirty one of the thirty five yachts started within 33 seconds or less of their handicap. Two yachts started too soon and may have cost CONQUEST (Paul Jacka) 13 places and SALT WHISTLE (Alex Hall) 2 places at the finish. MELTEMI SYC won Start of the Day and the median start time was 11 seconds








It is unusual to have a tie at the finish line of WW but CASSANDRA of MELBOURNE and **UPBEAT** both finished at 16:02:03. The fleet started 69 minutes 1 second apart and this gap reduced to 26 minutes 58 seconds at the end of the race. Only 7 yachts finished within 10 minutes of the winner.

The average finish position for the 12 early starters was about 9th. For the mid fleet starters it was about 24th and 22nd for the late starters.





The average elapsed time of 2:08:05 was the longest of any race this series. Nevertheless, all 35 starters finished the race and 2 yachts sailed the course within 1 second of each other. With a handicap of 32 minutes FUN & GAMES (Alan Edwards) sailed the course in 2:06:21 whilst WATERMARK II (Herschel Landes) with a handicap of 33 minutes sailed the course in 2:06:22.

With 25 decreased handicaps (green) and 12 increased (red) the average handicap fell from 29 to 28 minutes.
