



## J24 Victorian State Championships

### NOTICE OF RACE

The Organising Authority for this Regatta is the Sandringham Yacht Club Inc.

Sandringham Yacht Club (SYC) invites entries for J24 Victorian State Championships, scheduled to be sailed off Sandringham, Victoria on 30 and 31 March 2019.

#### 1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), Prescriptions and Special Regulations of Australian Sailing (AS) and Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2. J24 Class Rules, unless otherwise stated, will apply.
- 1.3. AS prescriptions to Rule 46 will apply.
- 1.4. All competitors are required to wear an approved Personal Floatation Device (PFD) which complies with Australian Sailing SR Part 2, R 5.01 whilst afloat (this amends RRS 40).

#### 2. ALTERATION OF CLASS RULES

The rules of the International J24 Class 2019 are changed as follows:

- 2.1. Where a boat deviates from the rules of measurement on hull and rigging, such deviation may be considered legal when a class measurer is satisfied that the item in question is "as supplied by the licensed builder at the time of manufacture". The measurement certificate shall be endorsed appropriately by the class measurer.
- 2.2. Class rule C.2.1(b) is changed as follows: A boat may sail with different crew on different days provided the crew changes are declared at registration. The number of declared crew shall remain the same throughout the regatta. Crew changes not declared at registration require advance written approval of the Race Committee and will only be approved in exceptional circumstances.
- 2.3. Class rule C.10.2 is changed as follows: A boat may carry one Mainsail, one Genoa, one Jib and two (2) Spinnakers on-board while racing. The use of Spinnakers is subject to Class Rule J.2.

#### 3. ADVERTISING

- 3.1. Boats may be required to display Regatta sponsor's name / logo. The Class Association will supply these items and they shall be affixed and / or worn as prescribed in the Sailing Instructions.

#### **4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY**

The regatta is open to boats of the International J24 Class that comply with class rules, AS category 6 safety requirements and that fulfil the following requirements:

- 4.1. The J24 boats shall be owned and entered by a member of a club affiliated with AS and who is a member of AS.
- 4.2. All competitors shall be members of AS and an Australian J24 State Association. If membership is not paid for all crew/skippers- race results will not count, until all memberships are paid in full.
- 4.3. The owner of the J24 boat as shown on the measurement certificate shall be a member of their State Class Association.
- 4.4. The helmspersons nominated on the 'Entry Form' will be deemed to be in charge of the boat and no change of helmsperson shall be made without the written consent of the Race Committee.
- 4.5. Eligible boats must submit entries online via the website:

- 4.6. No entries will be accepted after 1900hrs on Friday 29 March 2019.

#### **5. ENTRY FEES**

- 5.1. Normal entry fee:       \$225.00
- 5.2. Inter State Boats       \$175.00

#### **6. REGISTRATION & MEASUREMENT**

- 6.1. Registration will be conducted in the SYC Auditorium on Friday 29 March 2019 between 1600hrs to 1900hrs and on Saturday 30 March between 0700hrs and 0830hrs.
- 6.2. The Organising Authority and/or J24 National Association representative may conduct measurement and inventory checks of competing boats at anytime before, during and after racing.
- 6.3. Unmeasured sails shall be presented for measurement at the SYC prior to 1800hrs on Friday 29 March.
- 6.4. Crew weigh in will be from 1600hrs to 1900hrs on Friday 29 March and from 0700hrs to 0830hrs on Saturday 30 March at SYC Auditorium. All crew must be weighed prior to 0830hrs Saturday 30 March.
- 6.5. Boats may be checked for race weight before entry into water. All up-racing weight is 1330kg.
- 6.6. A copy of the boats' current measurement certificate, insurance certificate and inventory of required and optional equipment form shall be lodged at registration.

#### **7. RACE FORMAT**

- 7.1. Regatta format will be boat start, windward-leeward laid course fleet races.

#### **8. HAUL OUT RESTRICTIONS**

- 8.1. The Regatta will be a Wet Regatta, and all boats must be in the water before 2100 hrs on Friday 29 March.
- 8.2. Boats shall not be hauled out during the regatta except with and in accordance with the terms of prior written permission of the race committee.

## **9. BERTHING**

- 9.1. Mooring overnight in the SYC marina at no cost is available for the nights of 29 and 30 March – Information regarding location of berths will be provided at registration.

## **10. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

- 10.1. Sailing Instructions will be available upon registration at SYC from the Regatta Office - Auditorium and will be available online on the SYC website and the National J24 website prior to the event.

## **11. RACING AREA**

- 11.1. The races will be conducted on Port Phillip off SYC.

## **12. COURSES**

- 12.1. Courses will be as described in the Sailing Instructions.

## **13. RACE PROGRAM**

- 13.1. Crew briefing will be held in the Auditorium at 0830hrs on Saturday 30 March.  
13.2. First warning signal for day's racing will sound no earlier than 0955hrs on Saturday 30 March and Sunday 31 March.  
13.3. No more than 5 races are scheduled on either day.  
13.4. No warning signal will be made after 1600hrs on Saturday 30 March or 1430hrs on Sunday 31 March 2019.  
13.5. The number of scheduled races is eight (8) of which three (3) shall be completed to constitute a regatta.  
13.6. There will be no resails after Sunday 31 March 2019.

## **14. SCORING**

- 14.1. When fewer than 6 races are competed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores with no exclusions.  
14.2. When 6 or more races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.  
14.3. Performance Handicap System (PHS) results will be decided by application of the Time Correction Factor (TCF) to the elapsed times. The PHS TCF will be allocated by the Race Committee and may be recalculated between races and will not be subject to redress. This changes RRS 62.1 (a).

## **15. PRIZES**

- 15.1. Results and prizes will be announced after the final race on Sunday 31 March at the Ken King Centre or Members Lounge if weather is inclement.  
15.2. Prizes will be awarded for boats placed first to third overall and first to third on PHS handicap.

## **16. SAFETY**

- 16.1. The safety category applicable to this regatta is AS Category 6. The safety declaration will not remain valid unless the boat, together with its safety equipment, is maintained in accordance with the requirements of the relevant safety category.  
16.2. Safety declaration shall be lodged by marking the applicable box on the on-line entry.  
16.3. All boats shall carry a working waterproof VHF radio capable of operating at least on channels 16, 67, 69, 71 73 and 77.

## 17. INSURANCE

- 17.1. All competing boats shall have public liability insurance with racing endorsement for an amount of not less than Ten Million Dollars (AUD10,000,000).

## 18. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 18.1. All those taking part in races conducted by SYC do so at their own risk and responsibility. SYC and the J24 Class Association is not responsible for the seaworthiness of a boat whose entry is accepted or the sufficiency or adequacy of its equipment.
- 18.2. SYC and the J24 Class Association is not responsible for any damage, injury or death, either ashore or at sea to persons or boats, which might result from participating in races conducted by SYC.
- 18.3. Competitor attention is drawn to RRS Fundamental Rules 3 and 4:

### Fundamental Rule 3 – Acceptance of the Rules:

“By participating in a race conducted under these Racing Rules, each competitor and boat owner agrees:

- (a) to be governed by the Rules;
- (b) to accept the penalties imposed and other action taken under the Rules, subject to appeal and review procedures provided in them, as the final determination of any matter arising under the Rules; and
- (c) with respect to any such determination, not to resort to any court of law or tribunal.

### Fundamental Rule 4 - Decision to Race:

“The responsibility for a boat’s decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.”
