
SUNDAY SAILORS REPORT 31 JULY 2022




Results


La Belle Vie racing off into a yellow sky and a future second place!!

Foggy Dew demonstrating a new style of starting manoeuvre – going the wrong way!!


Half Time Score

Elapsed times


