


The Race

With a forecast 20 knot westerly, course 29 with a Southerly start was selected.

Actual wind during the race was variable in the range 17 to 26 knots.





14 boats started and 2 withdrew (Debonnaire and Bushranger) with equipment issues.

No boats requested the spinnaker penalty.



The Start

The start was a bit tricky for skippers seeking a 0, 1 or 2 second start with conditions of a 20 knot westerly requiring a port reach approach to the southerly start line.

Congratulations to La Mer (Dufour 36e Performance, Michael Ebling) who nailed it for start of the day at 5 seconds. They were closely followed by First Passion (Beneteau First 35, Simon Lipman) who was across the line one second later at 6 seconds.

The rest of the fleet had starts of more than 30 seconds.






Boat Speed

Luminere (Beneteau First 50, Matt Kebbell) on a handicap of 47 was the fastest round the course at 90.1 minutes.

She was followed by La Mer (Dufour 36e Performance, Michael Ebeling) at 93.7 minutes on a handicap of 40 and Foggy Dew (Northshore 369, Robert D'Arcy) at 95.5 minutes on a Handicap of 45.

<u>Debonnaire</u>

Debonnaire retired with a torn jib. Larry understands that this is the second time this same jib has torn. Rumour has it that skipper Phil Gomez is on the hunt for either super strength sail repair stitching or a new jib.

Winsome had the misfortune to break a genoa sheet but with a capable crew were able to quickly swap it out, resume the race and went on to 3rd place. Well done.

After the race the Winsome skipper, Simon Hemingway, was heard vocalising with conviction that this sheet breakage cost them 5 minutes and 50 seconds. And that otherwise Winsome would have convincingly won that race.

Recognizing Simon's reputation for honesty, modesty and accurate judgement, the handicapper in overhearing this decided to give Winsome the benefit of the doubt and adjust their handicap as if it was a win.
