


The Race

With a forecast of a steady NNW 14 knots, course 24 with a Northerly start was selected.

However the wind gusted above forecast, touching up to 23 knots at its peak.





18 boats started and 1 (Lumiere) retired.

5 boats enacted the Spinnaker penalty option (La Mer, Foggy Dew, Firefox, Emerald and Lawless).

This is the second last race for the series with the final race on 11 September.

Boats Entered and Results

The Winners

Congratulations Winsome (Jeanneau Sunfast 40, Simon Hemmingway, handicap 33) as the winning boat. They led the second-place boat La Mer (Dufour 36E Performance, Michael Ebeling, handicap 42) by just 26 seconds.

In third place was First Passion (Beneteau First 35, Simon Lipman, handicap 33) who were 2 minutes and 40 seconds behind La Mer.

La Belle Vie (Beneteau Oceanis 45, Grant and Nathan Anderson) is leading the series with a significant 9-point lead over the next boats. In equal second place are Alegria (Cataline 309, Simon May) and Winsome (Jeanneau Sunfast 40, Simon Hemmingway), and just 3 points behind in fourth place is La Mer (Dufour 36E Performance, Michael Ebeling).

With one race to go in the series it looks like La Belle Vie will hold the lead and Alegria, Winsome and La Mer will battle it out for second and third place on the podium.


The Start




Boat Speed

La Mer (Dufour 36E Performance, Michael Ebeling) with a spinnaker handicap of 42 was the fastest boat on the day with an elapsed time of 105 minutes.

Second fastest boat with an elapsed time of 107 minutes was Foggy Dew (Northshore 369, Robert D'Arcy) with a Spinnaker handicap of 45.

The third fastest boat with an elapsed time of 113 minutes was Winsome (Jeanneau Sunfast 40, Simon Hemmingway) on a handicap of 33.





General Gossip and Handicap Monitoring

Leeward Larry – Champion Justice Warrior.

Leeward Larry is a relentless supporter of those who suffer from injustice: In this case Phil Gomez and Debonnaire.

Larry heard on the SYC grapevine that the skipper of Debonnaire was worried that something underhand was going down when the start of the day for race 9 (14th August) was given to a boat that had a 5 second start. The issue is that Debonnaire had a 4 second start before retiring from the race.

Recognising the misery and plight of Debonnaire over this alleged injustice, Larry went into a forensic enquiry of the rules.

The result: Start of the Day can be awarded to any boat that starts, regardless of whether they finish. There is no rule to the contrary.

So herewith Debonnaire and Phil Gomez will be retrospectively awarded SotD for Race 9.

Handicap Movement Tracking

The table below shows changes in handicap for the boats in race 10.

It appears that a number of boats had some Handicap relief for race 10 with Isa Lea being the only boat with an increased handicap of +3 minutes following their win in Race 9.

We watch with interest to see what will now happened to Winsome's handicap for the last race in the series.
