


The Race

The Winners

Congratulations to Valiant (David Keyes-Tilley, Adams 10.6, Handicap of 30) as the winning boat with crew of Ian Hetherington, Adam Keyes-Tilley, Kate Keyes-Tilley & Ian Richards.

Winning by around 4 minutes to the second place, and after also coming 3rd place in the first race, Leeward Larry predicts a serious handicap adjustment is imminent for Valiant.

In second place was La Mer (Dufour 36E Performance, Michael Ebeling, handicap 39) approx. 4 minutes behind Valiant.

In third place was Lebrok (Theo Korbel, Beneteau 36.7, Handicap 33) who were around 1 minutes behind La Mer.

After 2 races, Valiant is willing the series to date followed by Lebrok and then Alliance.



Congratulations also to Skullduggery for winning Start of the Day on 3 seconds.






Boat Speed

La Mer (Dufour 36E Performance, Michael Ebeling) with a non-spinnaker handicap of 39 was the fastest boat on the day with an elapsed time of 115 minutes.

The second fastest boat was the winning boat Valiant on 120.4 minutes followed by Lebrok at 122.4 minutes.

Handicap Tracking

The table below shows changes in handicap for the boats in Race 2 after the first race for the series.

Perplexingly it is noted that 11 boats had some handicap relief and two boats copped a handicap hit.

The two boats penalised were Alliance (2 minutes) after winning the previous race and Emerald (1 minute) after second place previously. No change for Valiant after 3rd place in the previously race.

Many boats won some handicap relief after finishing around the middle of the fleet in the previous race.

The Handicap Mystery

To unwrap this mystery, Leeward Larry manned-up and approached our esteemed and much valued Handicapper with the intent to understanding how his handicap system works 'for Sunday Sailors'.

What You Always Wanted To Know About SS Handicaps But Were Afraid To Ask

Firstly – SS handicaps are weather forecast influenced.

Sunday Sailors handicaps are finalised as late as possible the day before after receiving the latest forecast as an input, and may be weather adjusted. For example, heavier boats may be considered sympathetically in a light wind forecast day, and vice versa.

<u>Secondly</u> – Considers boat performance history rather than just one-off moments of glory.

Our handicapper advised that he does not seek to penalise boats for an abnormal podium finish, or give handicap relief if a boat finished further back in the fleet than normal.

Other Inputs – Elapsed Time

Boats that finish late after starting late, or after starting early and copping the 5-minute penalty cannot expect handicap relief as a result of poor starting performance. The Handicapper consider the elapsed time records as an input to assessing boat performance.

Our Sunday Sailors boats can expect a more complex, considered and dynamic handicap setting than previous methods that seemed to involve just impacting the first and last 3 boats.
