

The Race

Race 8 on 22 January was run in light southerly winds of around 6 knots at the start then slowly, very slowly, increasing to around 10 knots by the finish.



Courses 22 was selected with a Northerly downwind start to take the fleet on a broad reach to Brighten mark R2, then a beat back to SYC 5 and then a dead run to the finish in a shortened course.

The Fleet

21 boats entered with 1 boat (38 DEGREES SOUTH) retiring.

8 boats called in the spinnaker handicap (DEBONNAIRE, LA MER, RAZZLE DAZZLE, SKULLDUGGERY, WINSOME FIREFOX, FIRST LIGHT and ANTARES).

On the subject of spinnakers, those familiar with WINSOME (Simon Hemingway, Jeanneau Sunfast 40) were gobsmacked to hear them call in to use their spinnaker. For the last 7 years and 3 months they have resisted bring it out pending perfect light weather conditions. It's understood that 3 generations of moths flew out when the bag was unsealed.

Also, we welcomed a new boat to the fleet, SHEBA (Michael Pisani, an Elliot 7) who was given a debut handicap of 24. For her first race in Sunday Sailors, she sailed well and would have finished equal 6th if not knocked out with an ENP Penalty for not correctly signing on. We look forward to seeing more of them.



AMICUS II did 1 second and DEBONNAIRE 3 seconds. 14 boats achieved starts of less than 24 seconds.






Boat Speed

DEBONNAIRE blitzed the field, starting last on a 47-minute spinnaker adjusted handicap to deliver an elapsed time of 112 minutes which was 11 minutes faster than the next fastest boat to win the race.

The second fastest boat around the courses was LA MER on 123.5 minutes followed by LEBROK on 128.9 minutes.





Handicap Monitoring

The table below shows changes in handicap for the series to date.

Its interesting to see that LA BELLE VIE (11th place last race) and HITCHIKER (8th place last race) won 2-minute handicap reliefs for this race for reasons that will remain the secret of our esteemed handicapper.
