
SUNDAY SAILORS REPORT FEBRUARY 19 2023

Intro

A beautiful Sunday Morning in the 20's, mostly sunny, but no wind to start with. Although Fawkner Beacon was showing 8 knots at the start, we didn't see any of it until about 11AM, then then only in fits and starts. The course was number 12 at 9.3nM but we warned before the start that it would be shortened!! We saw zero to 5 knots with one "blast of 7-8 knots" with a couple of puffs at 12 knots. Wind wandered between SW and SE. We completed a lap of 5 (what a long way out when there is no wind), to 2 then 3 and home where the race was stopped. We shared the course with the J24's – more of that later, and a couple of annoying speedboats who enjoyed showing us their toys, several times through the middle of the fleet when we had little wind. Ten boats flew spinnakers



Results

Ten boats flew spinnakers and they were rewarded with 5 of the top 7 placings. The lack of wind at the start really punished the early handicap boats as in effect they started 300 mtrs in front of the 40 footers. First was **Sheba (Michael and Robert Pisani)** who finished well in front of second place getter, **38 South (John Chatham)** with a passionate **First Passion (Simon Lipman)** finishing third. Fourth and fifth were **Debonnaire (Phil Gomez)** and **Dullduggery (Garry McGirdle)** with some controversy at the finish. Sixth over the line was **Ellipse 2 (Johnathon Warner and John Lindholm)**, but they drifted over at the start 62 seconds early and were controversially DNS 'd. The author has twice "won" a race and had victory turned to ashes due to 1 second over, and then a tide induced incursion. Life is tough in SYC Yacht Racing. Two other boats were just over. **Skullduggery** and **Razzle Dazzle** (both less than 10 seconds). **Allegria, Panache and Isa Lei** couldn't finish in time. 22 boats toed the line, a nice turnout.






Winner today SHEBA with third place getter First Passion

Start of the Day

A very difficult start time was had by nearly all in a drifter. The shining light was **Hitchhiker (David and Penny Goodman)** with 1 second. To save the blushes I have only shown the starts that were within 60 seconds (positive and negative). The average start time was 181 seconds (leaving out the negative starts) with several boats 5 and 6 minutes late. **Valiant (David Keyes-Tilley)** and **La Mer (Michael Ebeling)** were also worth of a shout out.

Half Time Score


Only one lap so no half time score, no orange break or player substitutions.

Debonnaire was the fastest boat at 104 minutes. Second fastest was **38 Degrees South (John Chatham)** followed **by First Passion**. The average elapsed time was 136 minutes with an average

VMG of 2.82 knots around a shortened 6.4nM (estimated) course. The winds were, of course, very light at the start.






A drifter at the start.

START AND FINISH POSITIONS

The drift at the start really harmed the chances of the small boats whilst gave every opportunity for the later starting boats to come through. Big moves from **Debonnaire** (17 places), **38 South** (16) and **First Passion** (14). **Ellipse 2** picked up 10 places before being rubbed out.



SERIES LEAD

Skullduggery retains it's overall lead and this will not be affected by the Stewards Enquiry into starting irregularities in today's race (which will occur when this journalistic piece goes to press). **Valiant** has climbed back to second overall with a Valiant effort in today's race. **Razzle Dazzle** has taken third off **Emerald** with veteran stagers **La belle Vie, La Mer and Winsome** rounding out the top 7. It seems like a 4 way fight amongst the top 4 – as it has been for several races.
