



The Race

Race 9 on 5 Feb was enjoyed in very pleasant, spinnaker-friendly, moderate 8 to 12 knot WSW winds. Wind strength slightly eased through the race down to around 8 knots when most of the fleet finished.



Courses 27 was selected with two large circuits and a Northerly beam reach start.





The Fleet

22 boats entered with 1 boat (KALAKALA) retiring and three boats disqualified. More about that later.

7 boats elected to fly their spinnakers (SKULLDUGGERY, LAWLESS, RAZZEL DAZZLE, FIREFOX, SHEBA and EMERALD).

It was pleasing to see two new boats in the fleet, (ELLIPSE II, an Elan 35 owned jointly by Jonathan Warner and John Lindholm, and KALAKALA, a Beneteau 393 owned by Andrew Stopp formerly co-owner of RAZZLE DAZZLE)

Boats Entered and Results

The Winners

Congratulations to the 'official' winning boat HITCHIKER (David Goodman, a Beneteau Oceanis 41.1 off a handicap of 23).

HITCHIKER'S very able crew of David Goodman, Arthur Bertram, Jana Com, Penny Goodman, James Permezel, Rodney Warner and David Parker were seen wondering around the bar with ear-to-ear smiles not believing their luck after seeing another boat way ahead at the finish line.

The boat first across the line was ELLIPSE II (Jonathan Warner, an Elan 35, Handicap of 18) about 5 minutes ahead of the next boat their maiden Sunday Sailors race. But they didn't sign on. So were disqualified.

Also disqualified for not signing on was First Passion who would have otherwise come 17th.

And EMERALD was disqualified for using, but not declaring their spinnaker, would otherwise have come 6th in the race.

Congratulations for second place ISA LEA (Andrew Chapman, a Serendipity 28 on a handicap of 0). In third place was PANACHE IV (Egils Stokans on a Solar 40, with a handicap of -15).

SKULLDUGGERY remains as winning in the series closely followed by RAZZLE DAZZLE and VALIANT.


Series Results [PurHC] up to Race 9 (Drops = 1)



The Start

Congratulations to SKULLDUGGERY, FIREFOX AND LA MER who came equal start of the day on 3 seconds. Another three boats came equal second on 5 seconds (ISA LEA, ANTARES and EMERALD).

Nine boats had a <10 second start.






Boat Speed

DEBONNAIRE again blitzed the field, starting on a 47-minute 'non-spinnaker' handicap to deliver a fastest elapsed time of 100.2 minutes, 5 minutes faster than the next fastest boat.

The second fastest boat around the courses was 38 DEGREES SOUTH on 105.0 minutes followed by SKULLDUGGERY with an elapsed time of 105.2 minutes.





Handicap Monitoring

The table below shows changes in handicap for the series to date.

DEBONAIRE copped a 2-minute handicap penalty after winning the last race.

HITCHIKER had won handicap relief of 6 minutes over the series. Leeward Larry predicts this is likely to now be reversed after their winning performance for Race 9.

The biggest handicap changes over the series have been handicap reliefs for Lawless (19 down to 10) and Alegria (12 down to 6).

Noelle Corum Trophy.

Other Gossip

It seems the retirement of one boat and disqualification of three yachts has sent a few, or at least one, sailor off in a flap.

Simon Hemingway (WINSOME) was overheard opining that the retirement of KALAKALA, one of only two boats behind his WINSOME, unfairly pushed him into second last position.

But then Leeward Larry has analysed the results and observed that the disqualifications were actually a bonus to Winsome as all three disqualified boats finished in front of him. His true score for the race would therefore have been 20th (in lieu of his official 17th) if it was not for these qualifications.

Leeward Larry has also heard that the esteemed SS handicapper understands that this result was an aberration and WINSOME cannot expect handicap relief from this event.
