


The Race

Race 11 on 5 March included both the normal Sunday Sailors race and a WISC (Women in Sailing Challenge) as a separate, additional division for women skippers.

Boats registered for the WISC event had the opportunity to win podium prizes in both divisions.

The forecast was for a steady 9 to 11 knots north westerly. But that was not to happen.

The race started in becalmed conditions of around 3 knots, blew up to 23 knots then back down to 3 knots at the finish.



Courses 24 was selected with a northerly start and two circuits.

The Fleet

Third place for the Women's Skipper division went to Jemma Taylor on FIRST LIGHT (Beneteau First 47.7, spinnaker handicap of 33).



SKULLDUGGERY remains as winning in the series to date followed by EMERALD (Tony Tanner, Beneteau Oceanis 40) and VALIANT (David Keyes-Tilley, Adams 10.6) in equal second place.



The Start

Congratulations to SHEBA (Michael Pisani, Elliot 7,) who managed a 7 second start to win Start of the day in becalmed conditions.

In these conditions only 4 boats managed to start within 1 minute of their time, another 4 within 2 minutes, another 2 within 3 minutes and at the other end there were three boats starting more than 10 minutes late in drift conditions.






Boat Speed

DEBONNAIRE (Catherine Gomez, Beneteau First 45) again blitzed the field to deliver the fastest elapsed time of 89 minutes to end up in second place.

LA MER (Michael Ebeling, Dufour 36E) was next with an elapsed time of 105 minutes for third place and Skullduggery (Anne Goodfellow, Jeanneau 44DS) had the third fastest time of 110 minutes to win the race.

Interesting to note is that the elapsed time is calculated from the handicap start time to the finish line. This elapsed time can therefore be misleading as a boat speed indicator for boats that start very late.





Handicap Monitoring

The table below shows changes in handicap for the series to date.

SHEBA (Elliot 7) copped a 4-minute handicap penalty after race 10, reversing 5 minutes of handicap relief from races 8 and 9.
