## SUNDAY SAILORS REPORT June 4 2023 – Winter Series Second Race Sailed


#### Intro

A very pleasant winter's day with no rain, moderate temperatures, patches of sunshine — but maybe not enough wind!!!! It started light from the NE and got lighter. Stopped for a while and eventually came in at about 6 knots from the South and south east.

Sixteen boats toed the line and it was a day of very mixed fortunes. Many spinnakers saw the light of day.

This was the third scheduled race, but Race 2 was cancelled due to the conditions.

The course was Number 36 (I think) but we only sailed 1, 6, 3 and finished at 4. After drifting around at number 6 for over 30 minutes we thought we wouldn't get a finish in....



### Results


There was one tale of bad luck, which we will come to. The winner was the silent assassin **Peter Dunne** on **Upbeat** who clawed his way to the front to win, even without a spinnaker. Second was the very well sailed **Sheba (Michael Pisani)** sailing a very colourful asymmetric kite which was used to great effect. Equal third, in a great tussle at the line, was two warhorse boats, **Bacardi (Martin Power)** and **Winsome (Simon Hemingway)** although neither of the aforementioned gents were at the helm. The reliable **Emerald (Tony Tanner)** and **Soul Mate (David Keys-Tilley)** were 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>. It was (I think) **David's** first race in this boat!!

# **Start of the Day**

Start of the day was **Emerald** on 5 seconds. A great effort in the conditions. Other good efforts were **Skullduggery** (8 seconds) but after that the results were very mixed!!!


**Bacardi** and **Upbeat** battling it out on the "ghosting" second leg. They would go on to finish first and equal third.




A great result for **Sheba** – second.

### **Elapsed Times**

In very variable conditions, Lumiere (Matt Kebbell) was fastest-121 minutes followed by Bacardi-125. Then in order and close proximity: Upbeat 128, Winsome 129, La Mer 130, Skullduggery (Larry MacCarten) and Sheba. Average elapsed time of the finishers was 136 minutes for an average VMG (estimated) of 1.8 knots. Not surprising given the drifting conditions until the last 30 minutes!!



Average winds at Fawkner beacon was 4 knots. In shore it was less. This was the slowest completed race for quite some time with a fleet average VMG of less than 2 knots. The first two legs were a real drift, and at 11.40 it seemed that an abandonment was inevitable!!





Lumiere had the fastest time today – well done. Photo taken on a different day!!


# **START AND FINISH POSITIONS**

The biggest movers in the fleet were **Bacardi, Lumiere and Upbeat. Sheba and Winsome** also had good races. With **Skullthuggery and La Mer** also faring well.

Four boats didn't record a finish. Three ran out of time and then there was **Firefox...** (**Kim Beveridge/ Anthony Clyne**). **Firefox** flew their red and blue spinnaker and were so far out in front we all had given up. She sailed triumphantly around the course, finished 13 minutes in front of **Upbeat**... and then discovered she had forgotten to start with her spinnaker penalty!! So starting 2 minutes early earned a DNS.
