


#### The Race


1 % minutes behind in second place was **ALLIANCE** (Alex Hall, Benneteau Oceanis 46 off a spinnaker handicap of 20).

And in third place for the final podium finish was **ALLEGRA** (Simon May, Catalina 309, handicap of 2).

#### The Start

Congratulations to **HOT CHIPPS** (John Chipp, Dehler 46 of a spinnaker handicap off 52) with a winning Start-Of-The-Day at 6 seconds. Only three boats, Hot Chipps, Winsome and Razzle Dazzle had starts at 10 seconds or less.






### **Boat Speed**

The two fastest boats with an elapsed time within 1 minute of each other were **HOT CHIPPS** (John Chipp, Dehler 46 of a spinnaker handicap off 52) with an elapsed time of 99.7 minutes and the winning boat **LUMIERE** (Matt Kebbell, Beneteau First 50, off a spinnaker handicap of 35) with an elapsed time of 100.6 minutes.

They were followed by **LA MER** (Michael Ebeling, Dufour 36e Performance off a spinnaker handicap of 34) with an elapsed time of 104.4 minutes and **BACARDI** (Martin Power, Peterson 44 on a non-spinnaker handicap of 40) with an elapsed time of 106.1 minutes.





#### **Series Results**

Congratulations to the current series lead **WINSOME** (Simon Hemmingway, Jeanneau Sunfast 40, off a spinnaker handicap of 32) on 26.5 points.

Just ½ a point behind and in second place is **EMERALD** (Tony Tanner, Beneteau Oceanis 40, off a spinnaker handicap of 29) at 27 points.

And one point further back in third place is **FIREFOX** (Kim Beverage, Beneteau 38.5 off a spinnaker handicap of 27) on 28 points:

With only 1 % points separating the top three, and only one more race to go in the series, it is any one of these to win.

**Handicap Monitoring** 

The table below shows that the three podium finish boats all did so with serious handicap relief.

The most notable handicap movement was for the second-place boat **ALLIANCE** (Alex Hall, Benneteau Oceanis 46) with 9 minutes handicap relief over the last 4 races.

ALLEGRA (Simon May, Catalina 309) in third place did so with 5-minute handicap relief over the last 5 races.

And the winning boat **LUMIERE** (Beneteau First 50, Matt Kebbell) has enjoyed relief of 10 minutes over the last 6 races from an initial 42, now down to 32.

Other notable handicaps reliefs went to **RAZZLE DAZZLE** (-6 minutes over 3 races) and **SOUL MATE** (-5 minutes over the last 2 races).

**EMERALD** (Tony Tanner, Beneteau Oceanis 40) stands out as the boat with the most recent handicap increase following a recent bunch of good results.

### Other Gossip -

### WINSOME SPINNAKER ANOLOMOLY.

**WINSOME** (Simon Hemingway, Jeanneau Sunfast 40) had been awarded, but not utilised the extraordinary handicapper gift of an only 1-minute spinnaker penalty, when other similar sized boats had 3 minutes.

Subsequently Simon Hemingway announced that his lightest weight spinnaker was missing – lost or stolen.

But, for race 9, da-dat-da-da, in a gob smacking precedent his other spinnaker was found and hoisted in race 9. Obviously, our handicapper's encouragement worked, or was it the course 16 with a long spinnaker run. Leward Larry predicts that it shall hence forth be reset to the normal 3 minutes.

### **Appendix**: BOAT PROFILE: WINSOME (Current Series Leader)

Winsome is among the fastest 40 footers in the Sunday Sailors fleet and among the most 'Sunday Sailed' boats, having sailed continuously in Sunday Sailors since 2012 when she was purchased by Simon Hemingway. Winsome also sails in Wednesday Wonders and Thursday Twilights.

This was Simon's second keel boat, after Moncouer, a Spencer 30 jointly owned jointly with Geoff Lomdahl and sailed in Sunday Sailors for 6 years.

Winsome is a 2003 Jeanneau Sun Fast 40, which is the performance version of the Jeanneau Sun Odessey 40. Jeanneau advises: The main difference between the Sun Odyssey 40 and the Sun Fast 40 is the rig, which is taller on the Sun Fast (providing a P measurement of 14.9m versus the Sun Odyssey's 13.2m), carries more sail area and is set up with three rather than two sets of swept-back spreaders. The Sun Fast 40 also has a deeper cast-iron keel with lead bulb, drawing 2.40m.

In Sunday Sailors races she uses either a No 2 (recently recut) or No 3 Genoa and occasionally uses a symmetrical spinnaker. Skippering is often shared with Ian Soderstrom, James Mitchell, or Geoff Lomdahl.

Winsome is currently leading the Sunday Sailors series with a  $2^{nd}$ ,  $2 \times 3^{nd}$ ,  $4^{th}$ ,  $5^{th}$  and  $9^{th}$  place for the series. Neither Winsome nor Moncouer have ever won a series. Although close with losing a series win on a countback with Foggy Dew (readers to visualise Robert D'Arcy smiling ear to ear).

There is quite some rivalry between Winsome and Skullduggery, originating from when Skullduggery's owner Garry McCarten previously crewed on Winsome.

Winsome would say they kicked McCarten off Winsome for sailing incompetence, so he had to get his own boat. McCarten says he wanted to leave Winsome's crew but didn't have the heart to say so, so he purchased Skulduggery as a courteous and defensible reason to depart. Other versions are blocked by the SYC sensor.
