All three podium award boats were Beneteau Oceanis's.


The Start

4 other boats had starts within 14 seconds and 3 boats were more than a minute late.



Boat Speed

The fastest boat with an elapsed time of 89.6 minutes was **WINSOME** (Simon Hemmingway, Jeanneau Sunfast 40, non-spinnaker handicap of 33), 5 minutes faster than the second fastest boat **LA MER** (Michael Ebeling, Defour 36e Performance, non-spinnaker handicap of 27)





Series Results

SOUL MATE (David Keyes-Tilley, Benneteau First 405) is winning the series, one point ahead of **RAZZLE DAZZLE** in second place and 3 points ahead of **ALLIANCE** in third place.

HITCHHIKER has won the last two races and is now equal 4th with WINSOME.

Appendix: BOAT PROFILE: GRUMPY OLD MEN

GRUMPY (PREVIOULSY 'GRUMPY OLD MEN') is the most recent boat to join the Sunday Sailor's fleet, and the last boat to undergo a name change.

A 2000 Dufour 385, 'Grumpy Old Men' was purchased by Andrew Stopp from Geelong where she had been since new. The Dufour 385 has a displacement of just under 7kg and draws 1.76m. Andrew advises that she has not been well maintained in recent years. He has a significant maintenance list of things to sort - leaks, engine, electrical, needs new sails etc, to bring her up to optimum.

Her first SS race was Race 3 where she was given an inaugural handicap of 18. This was then tweaked down by 2 in Race -4 and then up by 1 to settle at 17 for this Race 5.

Andrew Stopp was the previous owner, and then part owner, of Razzle Dazzle which is now fully owned by Graham Jones.

With his new boat Andrew needs to now build a crew from scratch, choosing the honourable path to not poaching his previous Razzle Dazzle crew.

As you could imagine, young men and women sailors, or in fact any sane women, were not lining up



with eagerness to crew on a boat called 'Grumpy Old Men'.

That name, with associated hull graphic, conjured up images of sailing with old blokes whinging about the state of the world and how good it used to be back in the day.

A name change was in order.

So Andrew dropped the 'old men', and renamed her to 'Grumpy'. Then added a dolphin for the image, albeit a sort of grumpy aggressive looking dolphin rather than a cute happy dolphin.
