
SUNDAY SAILORS REPORT November 12 2023 – Summer Series Race Four

<u>Intro</u>

Sunday was dull and cool to start with but warmed up, the sun came out and in the end was very pleasant. Your fleet negotiated the vagaries of a 2XU half Ironman Triathalon on Beach Road to get to the yacht club. The wind was forecast to move to the South but didn't do so until the second last leg. Winds were fairly steady around 8-11 knots but with some puffs, lulls and wind shifts aplenty. There were a few fleets of dinghies out training which made things a bit exciting around no 4. The course was no 27 with marks start, 3,6,1,4,3,2,1,finish – northerly start and 9.36 knots. The course was not as favourable to spinnaker boats as last time, with only the last leg being kind to the symmetrical kite gang.

There were 19 starters and all finished bar **Panache 2 (Egils Stokan)**. Some boats flew spinnakers but the course was not kind , generally, to the forrard sail.

In an improvement in form, the winners by over 4 minutes, were **Hitchhiker (David Goodman)**, they led from the front for most of the race. **Grumpy Old Men (Andrew Stopp**) also showed improvement in their new boat, to finish a clear second. Third was **Soulmate (David Keyes-Tilley)** in what was likely their first podium finish. **Razzle Dazzle (Grahame Jones**) was an easy fourth. Twenty seconds separated **Lawless (Boyd Coulsen)**, **Winsome (Simon Hemingway) and First Light (Mike Coulter)**, with the smaller **Lawless** just edging out the two larger boats on the line, after all looked lost with 200 metres to go.



Soulmate finished third. Alliance won start of the day – 2 seconds!!!!!

Start of the Day

We saw the best starting in this race, possibly ever seen. All boats were under 40 seconds, and 60% of the fleet 10 seconds or less. Well done Sunday Sailors. Best start was **Alliance (Alex Hall)** on two seconds, with **Firefox (Anthony Clyne)** and **Sheba ((Michael Pisani)** recording 3 seconds.


Series: Start of the Day

Best two starts (after 3 races) has **Winsome in** front (8 seconds), with **Firefox, Alegria (Simon May)**, **Lebrok (Theo Korbel)**, Alliance and Sheba all on about 15 seconds.



Elapsed Times

In a very even field, Winsome was the quickest with 114 minutes from Bacardi (Martin Power) on 116 minutes. Very close behind were First Light (and excellent performance), Sheba, La Mer and Lebrok. Your correspondent had to correct the results as the previous race's handicaps were used in the official results. The average VMG was 4.37 knots in 9,5 knots average wind.

The biggest mover in the fleet was **Winsome** (10 places) with **First Light** (7 places) and **Razzle Dazzle** (6 places) also faring very well.
