


The Race


Approx. 30 seconds behind was the third-place boat was **SCRUMPY** (Rodney Warner, J24 off a spinnaker handicap of 19).


More than half the boats were a minute or more late to the start.



Boat Speed

The fastest boat with an elapsed time of 108.6 minutes was **38 DEGREES SOUTH** (John Chatham, Sydney 38, non-spinnaker handicap of 35), followed by **RAGNAR** (Richard Ekberg, Beneteau First 36, off a spinnaker handicap of 44).

The third fastest boat was LA MER (Michael Ebeling, Defour 36e Performance, spinnaker handicap of 44).





Series Results

WINSOME (Simone Hemmdonger, Jeanneau Sunfast 40, non-spinnaker handicap of 33) is winning the series by 2 points ahead of **SOUL MATE** (David Keyes-Tilley, Benneteau First 405, non -spinnaker handicap of 21).

In third place is the much-improved **HITCHHIKER** (David Goodman, Beneteau Oceanis 41.1, non-spinnaker handicap of 24).

Handicap Monitoring

For first SS race, the J24, **JOYRIDE**, was initially given the same 19 spinnaker handicap as the other J24, **SCRUMPY**.

Handicap adjustments of note were **LA MER**, docked 9 minutes, and **HITCHHIKER** was docked 10 minutes over the last three races as the consequence of their much improvement and shiny new jib.

Appendix: BOAT PROFILE: PANACHE IV (Slowest Boat in the Fleet).

Egils Stokans, proud owner of Panache IV declares it as absolutely, undisputed that Panache IV is the slowest boat in the Sunday Sailors fleet, with a handicap of '-15' minutes.

Panache IV is a Queensland built 1988 Salar 40 design. A centre cockpit boat with full length keel and a hydraulic in-mast furling main with verticals battens. A 39ft, 10-ton yacht, she has a beam of 3.4m, draft of 1.7m and a gutsy 84 hp Perkins.

Originally built for the Brockhoff family in Sydney, she has been maintained immaculately over the decades

by enthusiastic owners.



Egils purchased her in 2002 and renamed her Panache IV. His two prior yachts were named Panache I, an SS 30, and Panache II, a Holland 34 that he sailed in a Sydney to Hobart. But the name Panache III was not (internationally) available, so this boat was named Panache IV.

Egils, his wife Margaret and friends have crossed Bass Strait numerous times, circumnavigated Tasmania and sailed her to Noumea and Vanuatu. Egils says that centre cockpit, full length keel boats are seriously more



stable and ocean seaworthy - snug, safe and warm to be in. But impossible to steer in reverse. When backing out of their SYC pen they must be prepared for not knowing which way she will turn.

Panache IV best loves 18 to 20 knot winds. She can be very difficult to tack in lightish winds. Often, in say, 10 knots or less they will have to do a granny gibe to get around. In less than 5 knots they will typically need to retire as they won't get around the course.

Egils likes to be on foredeck. Helming is normally by Graeme Miller or Jillian Marshall. Egils, Margaret and their crew love the boat and sailing in these club races. They have no desire to upgrade to one of those new-fangled boats with a fin keel that might fall off.
