


#### The Race

## **The Start**



Not sure why – maybe they hadn't signed up for the series, or had done something naughty in the eyes of the tower controllers.


Also of note is that **ALLIANCE** started 6 seconds early. It appears an oversight that they were not penalised on the day. Leward Larry has been advised

# **BOAT PROFILE: ISA LEI (Oldest continuously raced boat in the fleet).**

ISA LEI is a Serendipity 28 that is sailed two up by Andrew Chapman and his wife Susan in Sunday Sailors races.

It was built in South Australia as a Spencer design in the early 70's, which traditionally had Polynesian names. ISA LEI was purchased by Andrew's father Bob Chapman in 1974. It has since been raced continuously at SYC, sailed by Bob, Andrew, his brothers and Susan. Very much a family affair.

ISA LEI has crossed Bass Strait several times in years gone by and was one of the smallest boats in the fleet. In the 80's she came 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Melbourne to Devonport race and 2<sup>nd</sup> in division in the Cock of The Bay.

The name ISA LEI (pronounced eye-sa-lay) is a Fijian expression with many meanings that can be used to express joy, happiness. sadness, sorrow, or beauty.

The boat also sails in Thursday Twilights with old school friends, Andrew is also currently crewing on Skullduggery for Wednesdays Wonders.
