
SUNDAY SAILORS REPORT JUNE 16 2024 – Race 6

Intro

Sunday was forecast cold but ended up being more mild than expected and sunny too.

18 boats started with one retirement. The wind was 10-15 knots (mostly 13-15) with a shift to the South at 11AM which made the last run squarer and allowed boats rounding 3 for the last time to lay the finish line without tacking. Just as the last boats were finishing the wind strengthened to 18 knots... A feature was the quality of the fleet starts in this race, covered in more detail later.



RESULTS

Razzle Dazzle (Grahame Jones) won in a good effort 2 minutes in front **of Isa Lei (Andrew William Chapman)**. Rounding out the podium was **La Mer (Michael Eberling)** two minutes further back. A distant 4th and 5th were **First Light (Mike Coulter) and Upbeat (Peter Dunne)**. Well done those crews.




Start of the Day: Firefox

Elapsed Times


La Mer and Hot Chipps both sailed the course in 103 minutes. Razzle dazzle was the surprise package and was next fastest on 104 minutes. This was aided by some good spinnaker work and two secret weapons on the boat (more later). The fastest 9 boats were only separated by 8 minutes with Razzle Dazzle and First Light (Mike Coulter) showing some form.

The average VMG was 4.85 knots in about 13 knots of average breeze. This was average speed for the wind strength, although the chop certainly threw the sails around going down wind – making it harder to maintain good speed.

Gossip and other matters.

I think next race it will be...... 5 minute penalty. **Atmospheric:** after 2 non starts a senior and highly respected member reached out to Mike and as a result of that discussion – a successful start. Bacardi and Winsome: not sure if anyone saw it but **Bacardi and Winsome** had a two boat drag race from no 3 to the finish. Winsome had a 2 boat length start and the result: a dead heat. 12th position shared!!

Upbeat: rumour circulated the club that Upbeat were over early at the start with a 5 minute penalty that would have pushed them down from 5th to 9th. The rumour was spread by an arch rival but **Peter Dunne** was relieved to learn it was not true.

The return of John Chipp: after some great results without John, who had been promenading around Europe, the return was heralded by a respectable 11th and equal fastest time.

Debonnaire and Emerald: these two boats diced for 2 legs, with **Debonnaire** unable to get through to leeward of the spinnaker wielding **Emerald**, watched with some interest by the boats just in front. **Razzle Dazzle**- a great result with not 1 but 2 Wind Whisperers on board: **Bob Reeves AND Robyn Brookes:** BR and RB!!
