
SUNDAY SAILORS REPORT NOVEMBER 10 2024- SUMMER SERIES RACE 3

<u>Intro</u>

Sunday was a lovely day, with forecast moderate winds (around 8 knots) from the S or SW shifting to the west and strengthening to about 12-15 in the early afternoon.

In actuality we had 5 knots swinging from SW to the South (opposite move of the forecast) and strengthened marginally as the race continued. There were some flat spots of wind about 4 knots. 23 boats toed the line, the biggest Sunday fleet for some time, although my colleague **Leeward Larry** has a more elephantine memory than me, so I am sure he can do better. We had one retirement early, **Panache 4 (Egils Stokans)** obviously not liking the light stuff.



RESULTS

A great win by **Mojo (Leigh Maddison/James Billson),** sailing off a very nice handicap, won by about 5 minutes, with a brilliant first leg. Second was the very well sailed **First Light (Mike Coulter**) who won a little bit of a battle with **Firefox(Anthony Clyne)** – who finished third. Well placed also were **Debonnaire (Phil Gomez) and Sheba (Michael Pisani)** – one of the smaller boats in the fleet.

Start of the Day

In a big field the best starts were **Winsome (Simon Hemingway) and La Mer (Michael Ebeling**) who started together , with a zero and a 1 second start. Well done. More on that later. Excellent starts also came from **Sheba** (2 seconds), **Alegria (Simon May)** on 3 seconds and **Ragnar (Richard Ekberg**). Any of these starts on another day would have won SOTD. 57% of the starts were 10 seconds or less and 80% were 14 seconds or less. Good starting on a day when winds were quite moderate. Starts of more than 60 seconds are not included in the graph below, to spare the blushes of those involved.....


Elapsed Times

Mojo not only won but had the quickest elapsed time – 86 minutes. Well done the Farr 40 boys. Hot Chipps (John Chipp) and Debonnaire were next fastest with 93 minutes, followd by Bacardi 95, Ragnar 96 and First Light 98 in an excellent result by them. The trusty off white code zero worked wonders for them.



START AND FINISH POSITIONS

The biggest mover was **Mojo (18 places**) who came from near the back of the fleet to win. Congrats. **Ragna**r and **Debonnaire** picked up 16 places, **First Light** 14 with **Bacardi and Hot Chipps** picking up 12 places. Despite the predominantly reaching conditions, the larger boats mostly came through with the smaller boats suffering. The first upwind leg was where major gains were made.



SERIES LEAD

After 3 races (no drops as yet) **Skullduggery** clings to the series lead, from **Hot Chipps and La Mer.** Further back are **Firefox** (who jump into fourth) and **Winsome** in fifth. Things may change a lot with the first drop.
