

The Start



Boat Speed

The fastest boat around the courses was **HOT CHIPPS** (John Chipp, Delher 46 off a non-spinnaker handicap of 44), with an elapsed time of 80 minutes, with compliments of the Skullduggery crew (See Gossip section).

WINSOME and **LA MER** had nearly equal elapsed times of 86 minutes.





Series Results
