
#### **SUNDAY SAILORS REPORT December 15 2024 RACE 6 SUMMER SERIES**


#### Intro

Sunday was a great day with very light winds and sunny, flat waters. A great day for the fair weather sailors, and out they came as we had 22 starters although **Spirit of Freya (Joanne Harpur**) left us before the start!! The wind started at about 3 knots from the East but shifted Southerly before the start and gradually strengthened to about 7 knots.



#### **RESULTS**

Well Razzle Dazzle (Grahame Jones) lived up to her name with a great most of the way win. She rounded no 5 first and was never headed. Second was those light weather wizards Ellipse 2 (Warner and Lindholm) who came from a long way back. Third was Debonnaire (Philip Gomez) who came from even further back, in a great return to form. Mojo (Maddison & Billson) and Sheba (Michael Pisani) finished well also. The course sailed was number 7 (?), anyway because it was shortened at number 4 the first time (a good decision from the Tower by the way) it felt like we were sailing Division A in the twilights!!! As we started in 3 knots and then it strengthened to 7 knots, it was never going to end well for the early starters as their start margin was eroded to almost zero by the wind speed change.

### **Start of the Day**

In light winds **First Light (Mike Coulter**) started the best at 2 seconds, well done. Second on 3 seconds was **Amicus (Warwick Stenford**) – a great effort given there was only 1 sailor onbaord. **Upbeat (Peter Dunny), Hot Chipperies (John Chipp) and Debonnaire** also had sub 10 second starts... Well done.

30% of the starts were 10 seconds or less and the average start time was 40 seconds in light winds (a nameless starter blew the average out by 15 seconds on their own). Starts over 60 seconds are not shown in the chart!!


The long term averages are: % within 10 seconds: 30%, average start times including outliers: 50 seconds.

### **SERIES Starts of the Day**

After 6 races (5 sailed) the standings are (best 4):

The field is limited because few boats finished the first race in rather wild conditions, and only 6 finished Race 5 in equally challenging conditions.

Series Leader Start of the Day **Winsome** (complete with tangled spinnaker)


### **Elapsed Times**

Mojo had the quickest time (again!!) with 83 minutes from Hot Chip (89) and Debonnaire (91). Ellipse 2 (97) did well and Razzle Dazzle excelled (105). La mer (101) would have done better but decided to go fishing.



### **START AND FINISH POSITIONS**

**Mojo** gained 17 positions from last, with **Debonnaire** very praise worthy 16. The **Chipp boys and girls** gained 14 places and very creditably **Razzle Dazzle** moved from 9<sup>th</sup> to first, (all on the first leg) wow!! Again the earlier starters suffered as they started in the lightest breezes, so when the stronger stuff came in their starts evapourated.



### **SERIES LEAD**

**Firefox** (6<sup>th</sup>) jumped **Hot Chipps** (8<sup>th</sup>) by 1 point to snatch the overall lead. **La Mer's** fishing expedition may have cost them the overall lead, as they are with 2 points of **Firefox**!!! The previous leader **Skullduggery (Harry MacCarten)** (see the last race report sections entitled, "I am stupid" - who am I to argue with **Leeward Larry**) is fourth. 5 points separate the top 4 boats...
